

Challenges faced by International Students

Self perceived insufficient language skills

The prospect of making mistakes causes anxiety

Difference in educational background

Academic integrity, understanding plagiarism

Barriers to group work are cumulative

In LSP, everyone has an equal voice

LSP provides a safe environment for group contributions to be made

LSP encourages creative and innovative thinking, sharing of ideas, and reflection

In LSP the models, stories and metaphors, and their meaning, belong to the builder and there are no right or wrong answers

In LSP, questions are asked of the model, not individual contributors
